SHOW AND TELL

Bill Morris showed several canes. They were made from Black Thorn (from England), Cherry, Walnut, and Maple.



Bob Shingleton had a puzzle rocker that he makes for the toy project. He also showed a large gliding rocking horse, made of Ash and Walnut, he had made for his grandson.

Glenn Pauley showed a blanket chest made from Cherry, Lacewood, and Bamboo veneer. It has Bracket Ogee feet and dovetail joinery. It was finished with a light Cherry stain and spray on lacquer.



Tom Schottle showed a Cherry cremation urn that was requested by Bill Reilly, the owner of the building we meet in.

Roy Reveal showed scroll sawed Christmas tree ornaments. He also showed several coasters with wooden leaves inlaid in each one. He also showed a clock with different kinds of wood at accents around the clock insert.



Doug Kemp showed two lamps he made from scrap wood. One is made from Cedar and the other was made from Oak. After turning them on a lathe, he used a draw knife to make it look as though they are carved.



Glen Jewell showed the prototype of a doll size pencil post rope bed. He is going to have a spindle turning workshop to make some of these for the Toy Project



DEMONSTRATION

Peter Howell demonstrated how to correctly and safely insert and set the blades in a conventional jointer head. He then milled a piece of Poplar on two sides on the jointer, took it to the planner and squared the other two sides. He took this turning square back to the jointer and demonstrated how to make a tapered leg on the jointer.
